MP3-Recorder		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - easy to use - sound quality - portable - lightweight - no moving mechanical parts - transferring data into a computer for editing is usually many times faster than real-time. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - editing may require data to be transferred into a computer.
