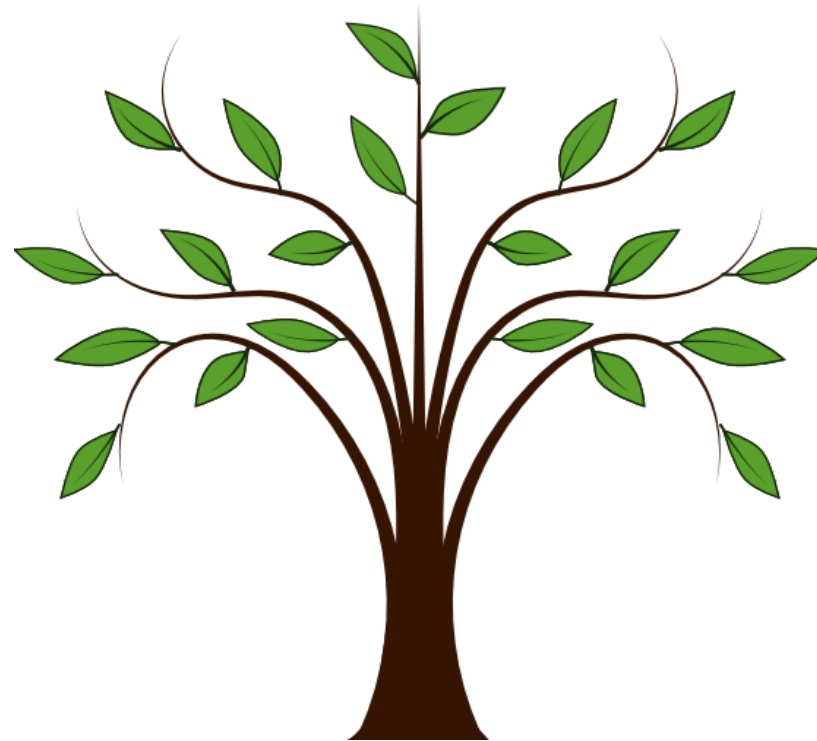

Jean Monnet Actions for Schools and VET



- Overall objective: to promote a better understanding of the European Union, its values and the functioning of its Institutions, at school and in VET.
- For pupils: to learn about the objectives and the functioning of the European Union, understand the common values of freedom, tolerance and non-discrimination and become active citizens.
- For teachers and trainers: to engage their professional development regarding EU matters.

Jean Monnet Teacher Training - Objectives

Main aim: to support schools and VET providers in planning, organising and delivering EU content.

- allow schools and VET providers to build knowledge about the EU among their teaching staff
- offer structured training proposals on EU subjects for schools and VET providers & provide content and methodologies for teacher teaching
- deliver specific individual or group training courses (modular, residential, blended or online) for teachers interested in the EU and willing to integrate EU subjects in their daily work
- foster the confidence of teachers in integrating an EU angle in their daily work.



Jean Monnet Teacher Training

Who can apply: One HEI or one Teacher Training Institution providing training to teachers (the applicant should be established in an Erasmus+ Programme Country)

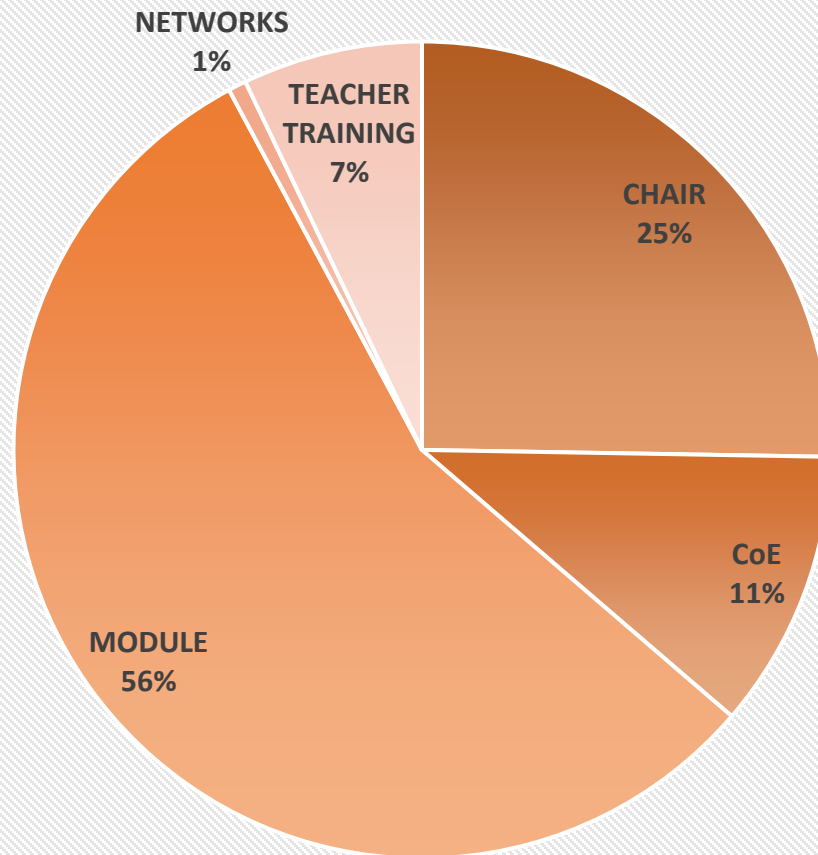
Duration of the project: 3 years

Max EU contribution: € 300.000

One of the following must be addressed:

- training about teaching methodologies in order to address European Union matters
- training on European Union matters
- learning experiences on EU subjects which complement already existing courses
- seminars, summer and intensive courses, other kinds of EU experiences involving other stakeholders.

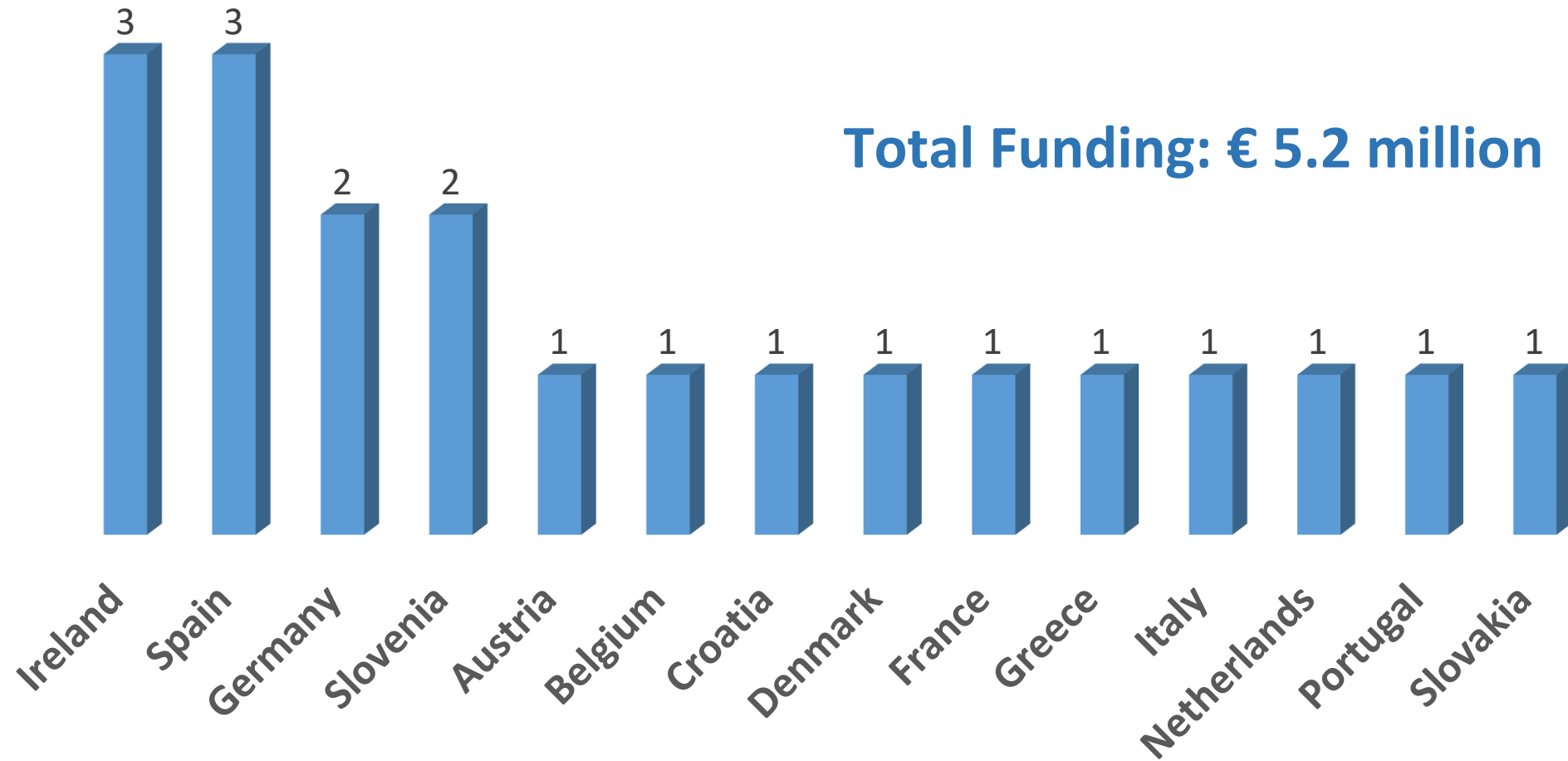

Publication of the call 2023	November 2022
Deadline for submission of applications	March 2023
Notification of results to applicants	max. 6 months after submission deadline
Preparation of Grant Agreement/Decision	max. 9 months after submission deadline
