

Against the backdrop of long-standing debates on the cultural politics (Ahmed 2004) or management (Hochschild 2012) of emotions, the situatedness of ethnographic knowledge (Haraway 1988) as well as an increasing interest in the affective constitution of social relations (Reckwitz 2015; Slaby & Scheve 2019), the upcoming conference aims at examining the relationship between ethnography and emotions such as fear (Lindner 1981), shame (Eribon 2018), anger (Rackow, Schupp & Scheve 2012) or happiness (Wulf 2020) in educational contexts. The role of emotions in ethnography is associated with theoretical, ethical, inequality-related and methodological issues. This aligns with an interest in exploring the relationships between the bodies of researchers and research participants, their respective social positioning and the audience of ethnographic knowledge productions. Emotions confront ethnographers not only with the question of how to document them in the first place, but also with the challenge of understanding and engaging with their elusive as well as overwhelming individual or collective character. Even if emotions remain largely not only fluid but also diffuse and ambivalent, they are strongly connected with questions of power and vulnerability, which can have long-lasting effects (Zembylas 2020). In this respect, a preoccupation with emotions leads to central questions on ethnography as a method, discipline, and research attitude in the sense of a historically embedded rethinking. Very different meanings have been attributed to emotions in ethnography's recent history. These include approaches suggesting limiting or controlling emotions (Beatty 2010) with a view on the so-called weakness of ethnographic data; using them strategically e.g. autoethnographically (Lubrich & Stodulka 2019); to engage with sensorial data (Pink 2009); deconstructing them representation-critically (Fichte 2005); or to make them visible – e.g. via reconstruction of atmospheres (Schroer & Schmitt 2018) – as a medium of comprehensive relations of inequalities (Wellgraf 2018).

The Rethinking Educational Ethnography Conference 2023 invites to reflect and build on current discussions of ethnographic epistemology, methodology, and practice.

Directions

By CAR from Karlsruhe or Basel (motorway A 5)


Take the motorway exit Freiburg-Mitte in the direction of Freiburg and follow the signs "Titisee-Neustadt / Donaueschingen" (B 31). After approx. 10 km, shortly after the Ganter brewery, which you see on the left, you will reach a tunnel entrance. Directly before the tunnel entrance, you must change to the left lane and pass the tunnel on the left. Follow the tram tracks until you reach a junction at the final stop. At this intersection turn right (signpost PH Freiburg), follow the road for a few meters until you cross the railway tracks. Then park on the left for free in the parking lot at the station.

By car from Titisee-Neustadt

Arrival on the B31 from Titisee / Neustadt. Shortly before Freiburg leave the B31 in the direction of Littenweiler. At a traffic light you will see the Volksbank on the right. Turn left here, follow the road a few meters until you cross the railway tracks. Then park on the left for free in the parking lot at the train station.

Parking lot occupied?

Drive to the parking garage of the PH Freiburg. Cost: 1€ / day. At the railroad crossing, follow Lindenmattenstraße, take the first right (Kunzenweg), turn right again (see arrow).



By PUBLIC TRANSPORT from Freiburg Central Station

1st possibility:

Take regional train S1 / S10 / S 11 direction Neustadt, Titisee, Villingen or Seebrugg. After two stops, you can get off at **Freiburg-Littenweiler station** and you will find yourself directly at the University of Teacher Education. Travel time just under 10 min.

2nd possibility:

Tram no. 1 direction Littenweiler to final stop Littenweiler Laßbergstraße. To do this, you have to climb the stairs at Freiburg Central Station to the tram stop Hauptbahnhof. The tram 1 runs every few minutes, duration with walk about 20 minutes.

From the final stop Littenweiler Laßbergstraße walk up the street Lindenmattenstraße. After a few minutes you cross the railway tracks. The conference will take place in the first building after the level crossing on the right.

Arrival by PLANE

By flight to EuroAirport Basel-Mulhouse-Freiburg, from there approx. 1 hour bus ride. From Zurich, Strasbourg, Stuttgart or Frankfurt Airport approx. 2-3 hours by train or car.
