I really enjoyed this trip to Marseille. We were a group of different nationalities: Germans, French, Nigerians, Canadians, Portuguese, Greeks, Italians... What a great mix! The group got on very well together, even though we were of different nationalities and didn't all know each other before the project. On the first day we gave presentations on inclusion at school, AI, teaching French in Canada... It was very enriching to be able to debate current issues in the field of education. The fact that we all came from different parts of the world enabled us to enrich our intercultural skills and compare different educational systems and methods.

Among the activities we did apart from the day's workshops, pétanque was a great opportunity to pass on a tradition from the south of France, a region where I myself grew up. We were also able to visit the MUCEM, Marseille's famous museum.

Finally, the picnic and swimming on the island of Frioul was a wonderful way to round off a week rich in intercultural exchanges. I'd advise everyone to take part in projects like this, because it's a wonderful opportunity that will bring you a lot, both academically and personally!
