

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#### Project Result 4:

## Training for lecturers on how to plan and conduct a Virtual Exchange

Basis of the training framework is the "Co-Laboratory Training in Virtual Exchange" created by the project EVOLVE. Our adaption of the training will be based on

1. a needs analysis within the project in three phases: broadcasting phase, scouting phase, needs analysis phase

2. **the Green intercultural mentoring tool kit**, which will be complemented by a "how to use" staff training module – including a self-experience for faculty.
